Her eyes lit up, and she began to share. She had attended that camp every summer, and winter camps, too, as she was growing up. She said her Dad was a single parent, and wouldn't miss sending his 2 girls as it made such a difference in their lives. She talked about all the things she remembered - the little monopoly contest boards we used, the camp songs, the life lessons that made such

She was now 47 years old, and we figured she'd attended camp the same years we were directing there. We don't know where she is at in her walk with God now, but that morning, God orchestrated a great reminder for her of the clear gospel message she had heard in all those chapel and campfire times. 
Jeremy & Amy are getting ready to welcome a baby girl, due Dec. 27th.
